Turn Off 5G & WiFi Calling HOW TO SWITCH YOUR PHONE TO 4G LTE



Below are simple, step-by-step instructions for most Android phones and for iPhone models. Menus can vary slightly by model and OS version.

Quick steps (most Android phones)

Switch to 4G LTE

- 1. Open Settings.
- 2. Tap Network & internet (or Connections).
- 3. Tap SIMs / Mobile network / Cellular networks.
- 4. Tap Preferred network type (or Network mode).
- 5. Select LTE / 4G (avoid any option that mentions 5G).

Turn off WiFi Calling

- 1. Open Settings.
- 2. Go to **Network & internet** → **SIMs** (pick your SIM if asked).
- 3. Tap Wi-Fi Calling.
- 4. Toggle **Off**.

Tip: After changes, toggle **Airplane mode ON**, wait 5–10 seconds, then turn it **OFF** to re-register on the network.



Switching iPhone to 4GLTE

Quick steps (most iPhone phones)

Switching an iPhone from 5G to 4G LTE

- 1. Open Settings.
- 2. Tap Cellular (on some phones it's Mobile Data).
- 3. If you use Dual SIM/eSIM, tap the line you want (e.g., **Primary**).
- 4. Tap Cellular Data Options.
- 5. Tap Voice & Data.
- 6. Select LTE (avoid 5G Auto or 5G On).
- 7. If you see **5G Standalone**, turn it **Off** as well.

You should see **LTE (or 4G)** in the status bar after a few seconds. If not, toggle **Airplane Mode** on for 5–10 seconds, then off.

Turn off WiFi Calling

- 1. Open **Settings**.
- 2. Tap Cellular.
- Tap Wi-Fi Calling.
- 4. Turn Wi-Fi Calling on This iPhone Off.

Using Dual SIM? Repeat for each line (tap the line name at the top to switch).

If those options aren't there

Some carriers or managed (work) phones hide Voice & Data settings.

Try: Settings → General → About → wait for any Carrier Settings Update prompt, and make sure iOS is up to date.
